The Poets' Pathway was very busy last year, working on plaques and a new website, making presentations, attending meetings about land, planning and creating concerts, and communicating with community groups, the City, and councillors, poets and musicians. We spent well over 2000 hours on the Pathway. This newsletter will catch you up, and let you know some of this year's plans. And on a personal level, we are very sad to tell you that our friend and colleague, George Wilson, past cochair of the Poets' Pathway, has been diagnosed with multiple myeloma.

JANE'S WALK

The Poets' Pathway is participating in Ottawa's Jane's Walk, May 2 at 1 pm. Ben Glossop will be leading a walk from Pleasant Park Woods and its trilliums through Billings Park to the lovely Butterfly Garden at the Children's Hospital. The walk is about a kilometre in length. We'll meet in the parking lot of Pleasant Park Public School, 564 Pleasant Park Road, at 1 pm. We will read some poems along the way, and hear a little local history. Do join us – bring boots or solid shoes as some ground is boggy/muddy, drinking water, a poem you'd like to share (if you have one), written by you or anyone else, and any stories or history of the area you may know.

PATHWAY OVER THE AIRPORT PARKWAY

We are happy to say that the city of Ottawa has decided to build a pedestrian footpath over the Airport Parkway, and Ben and Chris were at meetings helping push for it. A consultant suggested that the path be called the "Poets' Pathway Bridge." Wouldn't that be great!

PLAQUES

Our first plaques are going up!

A plaque will be erected at Britannia Beach at the edge of the Ottawa River as soon as we finalize arrangements for the ceremony. The plaque will feature lines from "The Song

My Paddle Sings," a poem by Aboriginal Confederation poet, E. Pauline Johnson. For our first plaque we thank the Bell Town Community Association, the Britannia Village Community Association and Councillor Alex Cullen, as well as City staff, for their enthusiasm. We will send out a notice when we have the exact date.

A second plaque is going up at the entrance to McCarthy Woods. This plaque will feature "Winter Uplands," a poem by Archibald Lampman. We thank the Hunt Club-Riverside Community Association and Councillor Maria MacRae for their support. We will let you know when the plaque is going up, soon after the one at Britannia.
