The walk begins at 8 am., at the stone pier in Britannia Park, and the plaque of Pauline Johnson's "The Song My Paddle Sings." It ends in Beechwood National Cemetery, where you can find Poet's Hill, and its plaque, and the poem by Archibald Lampman, " In Beechwood Cemetery." (Also in Beechwood Cemetery are the plots of both Archibald Lampman and his little son, and William Wilfred Campbell, Duncan Campbell Scott and many other poets.)

There are 5 other plaques along the way. They are beside Nepean Creek, at the entrance to McCarthy Woods, and beside the Rideau in New Edinburgh Park (Stanley Park).
